What has changed for 2017?

1. We are currently re-assessing our process for Equine Bridge and while we appreciate this creates some uncertainty, we will communicate the plans as soon as possible.
2. A reminder that a sire is now either graded, approved or licensed for breeding, or it is not. The responsibility for obtaining accurate information in support of a sire's eligibility rests with the person making the entry. It follows that the person making the entry is also responsible for any inaccuracies, whenever they may become evident.
3. Order of presentation of horses on the day will be as follows: three year old eventers and showjumpers first thing in the morning (starting 8am), followed by two year showjumpers, yearling showjumpers then showjumping foals. Then we will see two year old eventers, yearling eventers and eventing foals. Most likely it will be the afternoon when we see three year old dressage horses, followed by two year olds, yearlings and finishing with the dressage foals.
4. Owners are entirely responsible for the accuracy of any information they provide at the time of entry. BEF cannot be held responsible for any effects of the use of inaccurate or incomplete information as supplied by owners or agents. Information that you supply is not amended in any way so it is important that you enter it correctly, including upper and lower case letters and spellings. Please double check the information you supply, because this is what will appear in the catalogue and on your certificate. We will not reproduce certificates due to your own spelling errors. Additional certificate requests will incur a fee of £15 + p&p.
5. Hard hats at current safety standards are strongly recommended for all handlers and helpers. Hard hats are mandatory for the handlers of three year old jumping horses.
6. Horses should have their feet seen by a farrier, and if necessary treated, one to four weeks before an evaluation. Futurity will not be held responsible for reduced scores due to failure to care for your horse's feet and footsore horses due to having booked the farrier the day before an evaluation. All youngstock, including foals, require farrier assessment regularly.

7. Any refunds, permissible only in line with published policy, are subject to a £5 administration fee.
8. The minimum age for foal entries is four weeks (28 days) from foaling.
9. There will be no changes to entries after 3pm the day prior to any evaluation. Replacement horses and ponies are not permitted on the day unless the changes have been made by the owner prior to 3pm the day before the event.
10. Any Factsheet, Term or Condition may be amended at any time and any changes will be noted by amending the version (V) number on the relevant document.
